

Dear Mr. Sipple:

We have reviewed the Draft Cross-Acceptance Report compiled by the County Planning Department and have the following comments:

1. We concur with the text with the exception that Item #12 under Planning Outcomes "What areas in your municipality are being or are proposed for redevelopment?" the response of "None" should be replaced with this statement: "Although there are no formal redevelopment areas designated in the Township, the rehabilitation of dwellings in the Anderson area is an ongoing activity supported by the Township as part of its affordable housing obligation".
2. We need to point out that the name "Mansfield" is misspelled on all the maps that were included with the exception of the Sewer Services Area map. In all cases the "s" is missing.
3. We have not had the opportunity to thoroughly review the population projections and the methodology and assumptions used to develop them and would like to reserve comment for the time being. However, we feel that the impact of the Highlands Preservation Act on population will be substantial but this is not reflected in the population projections, especially in the case of Mansfield Township. Overall, for the County, the 2030 population projection with the Highlands Act is only approximately 5% lower than without the Highlands Act. In Mansfield with the Highlands Act, the population is only approximately 1% less than without the Highlands Act. In addition, despite the fact that Mansfield has the highest total acreage of any municipality in Warren County within the Highlands Preservation Area the percent of the County population that is projected to reside in Mansfield Township is actually higher with the Highlands Act in place (8.23%) than it is without the Highlands Act (7.79%).
